They formed the team originally to play in the Cookstown Streets League, before joining the Mid-Ulster League. They stayed in the Mid-Ulster League until 2008 when they were accepted into the 'new' IFA Championship and currently play in the **Ladbrokes.com Championship 2**. The reserve side compete in the Ballymena Provincial League.
